WATERSHEDS AND AOC

A watershed is all the land that is drained by a lake, river, creek or drain. The Canadian side of the Detroit River watershed includes three sub-watersheds: Little River, Turkey Creek, and the Canard River. Together, they drain almost 431 km² of land.

An Area of Concern (AOC) is a degraded location in the Great Lakes' basin. Below is a map of the Detroit River AOC and its Canadian watersheds.
